In early December, Theme 3 was confirmed as Choose to Boost Veggies and Fruit, starting in April 2017.

The focus of Theme 3 is to increase vegetable and fruit consumption in children, by encouraging kids and families to make vegetables and fruit a part of every meal and snack.

A **multi-component** approach is recommended, addressing:

Access and availability

- Supportive environments, cultural and organizational norms
- Knowledge and skills (individuals)
- Public policy

The timing (Spring-Summer-Fall) is a great opportunity to link with Ontario's growing season.

The Leadership Committee will be discussing the upcoming planning process at our January 18th meeting.

Consider ways to support this upcoming Theme:

- Representation from many sectors to champion healthy eating
- Increase access to healthy choices
- Improve food and nutrition knowledge and skills
