TRACKS: TRACKS is the Trent Aboriginal Cultural Knowledge and Science Youth Program, run through Trent's Indigenous Environmental Studies/Sciences program and the Kawartha World Issues Centre. Our focus is on the weaving of Indigenous knowledge and science to encourage youth to explore different ways of knowing.

Seeds for Justice: Seeds for Justice is a youth engagement program that brings university and high school students together to participate in workshops, using visual and performing arts to explore issues of social and environmental justice.
