

KEEP COOL IN PETERBOROUGH FINAL REPORT 2018-19

The Planet Protector Academy: Keep Cool is an innovative behaviour change program that inspires kids to become climate action superheroes, helping them understand core issues through fun classroom activities before sending them home on superhero missions to change families' energy, water and transportation habits.



THE RESULTS

Engaged 234 kids in 906 participant hours of inspiring environmental education!

Reached an estimated 468 family members

Saved over 48,000kg CO2e!

RECOMMENDED NEXT STEPS

Based on this year's results, we would recommend delivering the program in up to 12 classrooms in the 2019-20 school year, with a specific focus on closer collaboration with school districts and improving uptake in County schools. We look forward to working with you to make this happen!

MISSION 1: Operation Darkroom (easy, to get parents' buy-in) [180 reporting]

- Kids turning off lights more now: 71%

The **Planet Protector Academy:** *Zero Heroes* is an innovative behaviour change program that inspires kids to become zero waste superheroes, helping them understand core issues through fun classroom activities before sending them home on superhero missions to change their families' waste and consumption habits.



THE RESULTS

Engaged 218 kids in 1,117 participant hours of inspiring environmental education!


